Introduction

Bodhisukha School is a private English medium Co-educational Institute, established, owned and managed by Russa Road Young Buddhist Students Literacy Mission, Kolkata. It is affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, Delhi. It caters to boys and girls of all castes, creed and religion.

Background of the School: -

Russa Road Young Buddhist Students Literacy Mission was established in 1995 with the main purpose to promote and encourage the advancement of Literacy, Cultural. Moral, Scientific and Technical educations. It was duly registered under the Society Act. XXVI of 1961 of West Bengal on 31st May 1995, and also registered under the Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act of Govt. of India on 30th June 2000.

Classes

The classes are from Play Group to XII. The school has been recently upgraded to Senior Secondary level and has all the three streams Science, Commerce and Humanities.

Smart Class

To understand anything, visual effect is very important. So, we have introduced chapter wise smart classes for all subjects.

Educational Excursion

'Motivation creates interest' - That is the reason every year we take the students to Educational excursion on merit basis.

Sometimes students are also taken to nearby places like museums, movies and magic shows to develop their thinking outlook.

Every year in the month of December students are taken for picnic to interesting picnic spots where they learn the lesson of sharing and friendship.

Health Camp

'Health is Wealth' – Therefore, every year we organize free Health check-up camp in collaboration with Reputed Health Organizations for our students.

Every year in the month of April the school celebrates its foundation day through prize giving ceremony and cultural concert in Auditoriums. The annual fest usually continues for two days.

E-diary

From the session 2017-18 the school has introduced E-diary in which parents will get all types of information regarding activities held in school as well as daily assignments, students attendance, Routine & Syllabus etc. Parents and guardians can also communicate with the teachers of the school through this E-diary. The date and time of Parents-teachers meeting will be written in the E-diary (Bodhisukha School App) occasionally. So parents are requested to see the E-diary regularly.

Dispensary

The school has its own well equipped dispensary where qualified and dedicated doctors and nurses look after the wellness of the school students. Medical checkupsare given to students every month.

According to CBSE curriculum all the students are given fitness classes everyday under the strict guidance of proficient teachers.

Admission Procedure

Play Group: The age requirement for Play Group class is 2.5+ on 31st March.

LKG: The age requirement for LKG class is 4+ on 31st March.

UKG: The age requirement for LKG class is 5+ on 31st March.

Admission procedure starts from the month of September which includes an interface with the child and the parents (The registration forms and prospectus are available in the school office free of cost or can be downloaded from the www.bds.school)

I to IX: Admission for meritorious students from class I made only if there are vacancies in the classes. The school grants admission in Class XI in three streams viz. Science, Commerce and Humanities.

Forms submitted with the signature of parents / guardian and without a passport size photograph will not be entertained.

Curriculum

The designing of a school curriculum requires a vision. Detailed evaluation and improvements are made year after year in the curriculum. This has made it imperative for us to devise the most effective method for the implementation of the requirements of the curriculum. In an academic year, the school has to have 210working days out of which 180 days are devoted to intensive teaching and the additional 30 days are set aside for examinations and co-curricular activities.

Pre-Primary: -

The pre-primary wing of the school consists of Play Group, LKG and UKG and caters to the needs and demands of early childhood. Bearing in mind that the foundation of a child's personality is laid and two third of his intellect formed at this age, we have created an environment and a system of teaching which is entirely child friendly. Formal learning of the three Rs is introduced in Play Group & LKG. It finds a more prominent place in the UKG curriculum, which includes recognition, reading and writing of English and Hindi alphabets and small words and also basic arithmetical concepts.

Primary Curriculum: -

The syllabus become more broad based at this level and gradually the young learner is exposed to a wide range of subjects and study materials which are suitably graded. Apart from Mathematics, English, Bengali and Hindi, subjects like General Science and Social Science are introduced. Computer science is introduced in class I. As early as class I students learn to work on computers in the multimedia lab which has been specially equipped to meet the needs of the young learners.

Classes VI to VIII: -

Students of class VI to VIII study English, Hindi, Bengali, Mathematics, Computer Science, Science (covering Physics, Chemistry, and Biology) and Social Science (covering History, Civics, and Geography). Co-curricular activities include Physical and Health education, Work experience and Art education.

Classes IX to X: -

Students of class IX to X study English, Hindi/Bengali, Mathematics, Science (covering Physics, Chemistry, and Biology) and Social Science (covering History, Civics, Geography and Economics). Co-curricular activities include Physical and Health education, Work experience and Art education.

Classes XI to XII: -

Students of class XI to XII may take Science, Commerce or Humanities stream each of which covers 5/6 subjects.

Science stream: Any 5 or 6 subjects from the following group are offered - English Core, Hindi Core, Bengali, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Computer Science, Physical Education, and Commercial Art.

Commerce stream: Any 5 or 6 subjects from the following group are offered - English Core, Hindi Core, Bengali, Mathematics, Business Studies, Economics, Accountancy, Information Practice, Physical Education and Commercial Art.

Humanities stream: Any 5 or 6 subjects from the following group are offered - English Core, Hindi Core, Bengali, History, Geography, Sociology, Philosophy, Political Science, Physical Education, and Commercial Art.

Fees rules

Monthly Tuition fees and monthly transportation charges must be paid within 10th of every current month failing which Rs 50/- will be charged extra. Rs 500/- will be charged for re-registration for non-payment of three consecutive months.

All fees can be paid by cash/Card and Net Banking.

All students must wear the prescribed uniform when the school is in session. For boys, Black well polished leather shoes with laces (Naughty Boy/Cadet/Derby Type). For Girls Black well polished leather shoes with buckles (Ballerina Type).

As a prevention against mosquito borne diseases boys are advised to wear full length trousers and Black Leggings for girls. Odomos or any other medicated cream for prevention.

For winter months students from Play Group to Class II must wear school pull over/cardigans with school Monogram attached to it. Students from class III onwards must wear School Blazer with school Monogram attached to it. Students may wear Maroon coloured caps or silk scarfs to cover their heads during winter. No other winter garments are allowed within the school.

PT Uniform – House Colour T-shirt with printed Monogram, White trousers, white socks and white Keds. Track Shoes are not permitted.

Sports Uniform – Students participating in games and sports must purchase sports dress from school office.

Hair -

Girls: – Must be tied with black rubber band or black clips. Girls with long hair must do two Pony Tails or two Plats.

Boys: – Cut short – above the shirt collar and behind the ears.

N.B – Girls students in school are not allowed to wear any jewellery except small earrings. Any child who comes to school untidily dressed or incorrect uniform will be sent home.

School Academic Year and Timings

School Academic year begins on 1st April and ends on 31st March. Besides the Summer Vacation (30 days in May-June), there are 2 short vacations during the Puja (10 days) and Winter (10 days). The school functions on all days of the week except Sundays and third Saturday of every month.

School is open on Saturdays for classes III onwards 10:30 am to 3:10 pm. (Except third Saturday of every month)

Each and every part of the examination system is important for cumulative Assessment. No Student will be allowed to appear at the Annual Examination who **fails to attain** 75% attendance of the total working days.

Note: If any changes take place regarding exam system for any reason. That will be informed in time.

Co-curricular Activities

The Children from Class III onwards are divided into 4 houses – Red, Yellow, Blue & Green. Inter House competitions in Quiz, Elocution, Dance, Singing, Debate, Painting / Drawing, and Poster Designing are held on a regular basis. Facilities for Cricket, Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Badminton, Kho Kho, Athletics, Chess, Carometcare available. Students are encouraged to participate in all Inter-House competitions, and Inter-School competitions, organized by the CBSE.

Prizes

Proficiency prizes are given to the toppers of each class. Scholar of the year Cups are given to the toppers of all classes. X and XII Board Examinations toppers are also felicitated. Prizes in co-curricular activities held in the school are also awarded for outstanding performances. Best Boy and Best girl award is given to students to well behaved and disciplined students every year during annual meet.

To Guardians

Children will NOT be allowed to go home during school hours. Parents are requested not to make any social engagements or medical appointments during working hours. To ensure better discipline, parents are requested not to send their wards to school on the day, they have any such appointments.

Withdrawal and Refund of Fees
